The Paschal Triduum

The Paschal Triduum (the Sacred Three Days) is a single three-fold liturgy, beginning Maundy Thursday, continuing through Good Friday and culminating with the Great Vigil of Easter. Throughout our celebration of these three days, we enter deeply into the mystery of Christ's passion, inviting the power of his resurrection to remake and renew us. The service begins outside of the church.

LIGHTING OF THE NEW FIRE

In the darkness, fire is kindled; after which the Presider greets the people. The Presider concludes with

Let us pray.

The Presider prays a prayer of blessing over the fire. The people respond

Amen.

The presider leads a procession into the church, stopping twice before placing the candle in its stand to sing




At the second and third pause, the Versicle and Response is sung successively a step higher.


The candles-except those at the Altar-are lit from the Paschal Candle.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

After each reading, a minute of silence is kept before the response. A collect, sung by the Presider, follows each reading and its response. The people sing their "Amen" on a monotone.

Silence following the collect is marked by bells.






The valley of dry bones


The people greet one another with the peace of Christ, using a friendly gesture such as a smile, wave, or bow.

The presider says the "Words of Institution" that Jesus said at the Last Supper. At the Memorial Acclamation we remember Christ's death, resurrection, and promise to return at the end of the age saying

... and offering to you from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you :



During the prayer, the Holy Spirit is invoked to bless and sanctify the gifts of bread and wine and the people gathered in worship. The Great Amen is when the congregation with a unified great voice concurs with all that the presider has prayed. It is the only "Amen" in all capitals found in the Book of Common Prayer, signifying the greatness of the congregation's response.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, all honor and glory are yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.





THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

A minute of silence is observed as the Bread is broken and Wine divided into separate vessels.



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THE INVITATION

BCP P.364

As soon as the invitation is given, the people move forward to receive Communion.

Please come down an aisle to an empty space around the altar platform. Hold your hands in front of you to receive the Bread, and leave it there if you would prefer not to receive Wine from a shared cup. A server will dip your bread and serve you. Alcohol- and gluten-free options are available; let a server know your needs.

If you would prefer not to receive Communion, you are invited to come forward, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing. Please join in singing the Communion Songs after receiving.

POST COMMUNION PRAYER

When the presider bids the people pray, the assembly stands. Please remain standing through the brief announcements.

God of abundance, you have fed us with the bread of life and cup of salvation; you have united us with Christ and one another; and you have made us one with all your people in heaven and on earth. Now send us forth in the power of your Spirit, that we may proclaim your redeeming love to the world and continue for ever in the risen life of Christ our Savior. Amen.

The blessing is in four parts. After each part the Presider will pause, and the people respond **Amen**.

Liturgical notes

- The Opening Acclamation is from *Enriching Our Worship*, a supplement to the Book of Common Prayer.
- The Eucharistic Prayer differs from that printed in the Prayer Book. The Episcopal Church's 79th General Convention, in 2018, authorized (Resolution D078) a trial service of Holy Eucharist in "expansive language." This means, in this context, that the use of gender-specific pronouns and words such as "Lord," etc., are minimized, but are by no means eliminated. The dismissal is from this resource as well.
