As soon as the invitation is given, the people move forward to receive Communion.

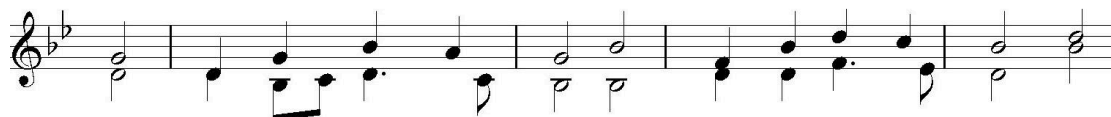
